SUBJECT: But Let Patience Have Her Perfect Work

We give Honor and Glory to our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, who is the faithful witness, the first begotten of the dead, and the Prince of the kings of the earth. Unto him that loved us and washed us from our sins in his own blood. We honor our Elect Lady, Prophetesses, Mothers, Evangelists, Teachers, Sisters, Saints, and you our beloved Friends. Jesus Christ is our Mighty Redeemer, Savior, Deliverer, Healer and our All in All. We must continue to be encouraged in seeking the Lord Jesus Christ; while it is called today for more Holy Ghost power and fire to be able to endure on this side of Glory. It is crucial that we be found pleasing in His sight and enduring in faith until the very end. The scripture says in Hebrews 11:6, "But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him". It is written in Revelation 3:10, "Because thou hast kept the word of my patience, I also will keep thee from the hour of temptation, which shall come upon all the world, to try them that dwell upon the earth". The Word of God lets us know plainly in James 1:2-4, "My brethren, count it all joy when ye fall into divers temptations; 3) Knowing this, that the trying of your faith worketh patience. 4) But let patience have her perfect work, that ye may be perfect and entire, wanting nothing". 1 Peter 1:7, "That the trial of your faith, being much more precious than of gold that perisheth, though it be tried with fire, might be found unto praise and honour and glory at the appearing of Jesus Christ". We can only "Let Patience Have Her Perfect Work" by the grace and mercies of God through the Holy Ghost. It is written in 2 Peter 1:5-10, "And beside this, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue; and to virtue knowledge; 6) And to knowledge temperance; and to temperance patience; and to patience godliness; 7) And to godliness brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness charity. 8) For if these things be in you, and abound, they make you that ye shall neither be barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. 9) But he that lacketh these things is blind, and cannot see afar off, and hath forgotten that he was purged from his old sins. 10) Wherefore the rather, brethren, give diligence to make your calling and election sure: for if ye do these things, ye shall never fall". Our Lord Jesus Christ is the Ultimate example of Longsuffering, Patience, and Agape Love towards mankind according to Isaiah 53:5 and verse 7. Verse 5 states) "But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed. 7) He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth: he is brought as a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is dumb, so he openeth not his mouth" (see Isaiah 53, Psalm 22). Luke 23:21,

“They cried saying, Crucify him, crucify him”. Ecclesiastes 5:2 states, “Be not rash with thy mouth, and let not thine heart be hasty to utter any thing before God: for God is in heaven, and thou upon earth: therefore let thy words be few”. Philippians 2:14 says, “Do all things without murmurings and disputings”. 2 Corinthians 7:1, “Having therefore these promises, dearly beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from all filthiness of the flesh and spirit, perfecting holiness in the fear of God”. Romans 12:1-2 says, “I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service. 2) And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God”. The word of God states in 2 Corinthians 10:3-6, “For though we walk in the flesh, we do not war after the flesh: 4) For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal, but mighty through God to the pulling down of strong holds;) 5) Casting down imaginations, and every high thing that exalteth itself against the knowledge of God, and bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ; 6) And having in a readiness to revenge all disobedience, when your obedience is fulfilled”. Ephesians 6:12, “For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places”. Galatians 6:9 states, “And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not”. Isaiah 40:29-31, “He giveth power to the faint; and to them that have no might he increaseth strength. 30) Even the youths shall faint and be weary, and the young men shall utterly fall: 31) But they that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint”. John 14:6 states, “Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me”. While our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ is knocking on the door of your heart, are you ready to accept him as your personal Lord and Savior?
